HomeKey Background

The State has announced <u>\$1.45 billion</u> in Homekey funding for Round 2. This is part of a statewide effort to sustain and rapidly expand housing for persons experiencing homelessness or at-risk of homelessness.

Of this total, \$1.2 billion is derived from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund (CSFRF) established by the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) (Public Law 117-2) and \$250 million in state General Funds.

KEY POINTS

- 1. Preference for PERMANENT HOUSING SOLUTIONS with a 55-year restriction.
- Tenants must be at-risk of homelessness and MLH will need to coordinate with IMACA through the Continuum of Care.
- 3. Minimum award is \$150,000 per door (\$1,650,000) but can leverage local match for 1:1 for up to another \$100,000 per door.

 Maximum award could be \$2,750,000.
- 4. Timing is aggressive but keeps project on track for occupancy in spring/summer 2023.
- 5. Some costs associated with updating documents for grant application (appraisal, environmental, market study, etc.).
- 6. Competitive minimum score is 120 points. Preliminary self-score puts MLH at 132.
