
Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...

Mono County and CA Case Summary By Area



Population Adjusted Case Rate per 100,000 (PCR-confirmed only)





CALIFORNIA COVID-19 DASHBOARD



If You Test Positive for COVID-19 (Isolate)

Everyone, regardless of vaccination status.

- Stay home for 5 days.
- If you have no symptoms or your symptoms are resolving after 5 days, you can leave your house.
- Continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.

If you have a fever, continue to stay home until your fever resolves.

CDC UPDATES AND SHORTENS RECOMMENDED ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE PERIOD FOR GENERAL POPULATION

CDC ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE GUIDANCE

If You Were Exposed to Someone with COVID-19 (Quarantine)

If you:

Have been boosted

OR

Completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last 6 months

OR

Completed the primary series of J&J vaccine within the last 2 months

- Wear a mask around others for 10 days.
- Test on day 5, if possible.

If you develop symptoms get a test and stay home.

If you:

Completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine over 6 months ago and are not boosted

OR

Completed the primary series of J&J over 2 months ago and are not boosted

OR

Are unvaccinated

- Stay home for 5 days. After that continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.
- If you can't quarantine you must wear a mask for 10 days.
- Test on day 5 if possible.

If you develop symptoms get a test and stay home

6+ months since your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna

OR

2+ months since your dose of J&J

UNIVERSAL MASKING REQUIRED FOR ALL PUBLIC INDOOR SETTINGS




- ✓ Masks are required to be worn in all indoor public settings irrespective of vaccine status through January 15, 2022, at which point California will make further recommendations as needed in response to the pandemic.
- ✓ Prior to attending an event, attendees will now require either proof of vaccination, a negative antigen COVID-19 test within one day of the event, or a negative PCR test within two days of the event. (500 attendees indoors or 5,000 outdoors)
- ✓ New travel advisory: all travelers arriving in California test for COVID-19 within three to five days after arrival, regardless of their vaccination status.

OMICRON (B.1.1.259) SURGE

- 95% of cases in the USA and CA are Omicron
- U.S. 7-day average of new cases: 400,000+
- People hospitalized: 82,898
- People in ICU: 17,562
- Pediatric hospitalizations up 66% in a week
- Deaths remain low




Region 9 **B.1.1.529**: 95.0% (95%PI: 92.3-96.8%)

OMICRON VARIANT IS 95% DOMINANT



- The rapid growth rate in Omicron infections is believed to result from a combination of increased transmissibility and the ability to evade immunity conferred by past infection or vaccination (i.e., immune evasion)
- At present, early data suggest Omicron infection might be less severe than infection with prior variants; however, reliable data on clinical severity remain limited.
- Data from South Africa and the United Kingdom demonstrate that vaccine effectiveness against infection for two doses of an mRNA vaccine is approximately 35%.
- A COVID-19 vaccine booster dose restores vaccine effectiveness against infection to 75%.
