<u>Title</u>: Update on the new Community Recreation Center at Mammoth Creek Park

**Agenda:** Consent Item

**Background Information:** On February 17, Town Council awarded the contract to the lowest responsive bidder, Hamel Contracting Inc., to build the new Community Recreation Center (CRC) at Mammoth Creek Park West. The Community Recreation Center will operate as an ice rink in winter, and in summer, proposed durable sport tiles will cover the rink creating a fully programmable and truly multi-use RecZone. The contract cost to build the CRC was \$14,831,040. Staff continues to work with the contractor and all associated vendors to finalize the construction timeline.

#### **ANALYSIS/DISCUSSION:**

This discussion item addresses Strategy Two: *Maintain and Enhance the Town's Recreation Infrastructure* of the Parks and Recreation Department 2021 Strategic Workplan.

Goal: Support efforts to plan, construct, program, and operate the Community Recreation Center (CRC) as directed by Town Council.

# 1. Facility Programming

Staff continues to work with Public Works/Engineering on the final design and components of the facility to ensure programming needs are addressed and incorporated into the construction plans where applicable and subject to available funding. Primary components include the Sprung Structure, refrigeration unit, dasherboard system, replacement ice-resurfacer and SportCourt tiles.

<u>UPDATE:</u> On October 20, Town Council, unanimously approved additional funding recommendations focused on Council established priorities and approved CIP as part of the FY20-21 Year End report. Significant items include: \$2.2 million of additional funding for housing (The Parcel and Town Housing Programs), replacement/Upgrade of the Town's underground fueling system (\$600,000), funding for drought resistant landscaping along Main Street (\$200,000), interior improvements for the CRC (\$350,000), funding for the CRC Mobility Hub (\$900,00), and additional funding for the Emergency Communications System (\$250,000).

Staff are working with HMC Architects and Hamel Constructing Inc. on finalizing design and cost estimates for the interior improvements and the Mobility Hub. Proposed interior improvements include the staff office/work space, rental area and counter, concession space, additional flooring, and sound system.

# 2. Operations and Management Plan

Staff has completed the draft of the CRC summer operating plan for commission review. Work continues on the staffing, revenue projections, finalization of the fee schedule and expense projections. The goal is to have this work program completed in the new year for the development of the FY2022/23 annual Parks and Recreation Department budget. The fee schedule for the CRC will be presented to the Recreation Commission and Town Council in March 2022.

#### 3. Facility Launch

This task includes the following work items:

• The contractor has completed the ice rink floor and entire slab.

- The Town has executed a purchasing agreement with Sprung Structures Inc. The structure will arrive on-site no later than March 15, 2022. Staff are working with Hamel Contracting Inc. to finalize the construction schedule and potential opening day.
- The project is now on winter suspension.

- Temporary Park Closure
  - For the duration of construction for the new Community Recreation Center (estimated 12 months), the Mammoth Creek Park playground, restrooms and parking lot will be closed to the public.

# 4. Communication and Fundraising

Communication and fundraising will be an important element of delivering on the mission of the Parks and Recreation Department: "To provide multi-purpose, year-round, indoor and outdoor recreation opportunities accessible to all residents and visitors."

#### **Program Updates:**

Staff will convene a community working group to further develop and refine a sponsorship program for the facility along with action items and associated timelines for implementation. This group will be finalized in December and convene in the new year. Items for discussion include the following:
