

Town of Mammoth Lakes Snow Removal Routes






Town of Mammoth Lakes Snow Plow Truck Route

Snow Patrol

- Assistance to Police and Snow Removal Operators
- Respond to:
 - Stuck / abandoned vehicles
 - Snow storage issues
 - Document conditions
- 2 Vehicles are prepared & equipped
- Staff have been trained (recovery and traffic control)
- Deployment is situational and voluntary

Mammoth Lakes

Snowy weather makes driving a challenge.
Driving during a winter storm puts yourself, your passengers, those traveling around you, and plow and emergency crews at increased risk. When possible, stay home or use free public transit.

WINTER STORM SAFETY TIPS

- **Look for and obey** speed limit and chain control signs (see back).
- **Slow down** – speeding is a major cause of winter accidents.
- **Keep your distance** from snow removal equipment and **do not pass**.
- Know how to **keep yourself and your child safe** when walking or playing in the snow (see back).
- **Remove snow** from the top of your vehicle.

TOWN ROAD CLOSURES

- **Davison Rd. is CLOSED** for access to Canyon Lodge – use Lakeview Blvd. or Canyon Blvd. Better yet, take the free bus or The Village gondola.
- **Sherwin Creek Rd. is CLOSED** for the winter and cannot be used as an alternative route out of town.

WHEN DO I HAVE TO USE CHAINS?

R-1

**AUTOS & PICKUPS
SNOW TIRES OK
CARRY CHAINS**

R-1: Chains Required: Autos & Pickups with Snow Tires OK

You must put chains on the drive wheels of your car unless you are driving a car, pickup truck, or SUV that has snow tires on at least two drive wheels. All vehicles must carry chains.

R-2

**4-W DRIVE WITH
SNOW TIRES OK
CARRY CHAINS**

R-2: Chains Required: Four-Wheel Drive with Snow Tires OK

You must put chains on the drive wheels of your car unless your car has four-wheel or all-wheel drive engaged and your car has snow tires on ALL four wheels. All vehicles must carry chains.

R-3

NO EXCEPTIONS

R-3: Chains Required: No Exceptions

You must put chains on the drive wheels of your car. There are no exceptions, ALL vehicles must use chains.

CHILD SAFETY

- Children should not play in yards or build snow forts during snow removal operations.
- Under no circumstances should children dig snow caves in berms – snow removal operations can result in cave-ins or worse.
- Roofs shed snow and ice – use extreme caution.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

- Keep your distance from snow removal equipment.
- Use paved paths and sidewalks whenever possible.
- Do not watch snow removal operations from the edge of the road.
- Remember roadways are slick and vehicles cannot stop as quickly, so use caution crossing the road.

Be Snowsmart this Winter!

Be Snow Smart by observing a few simple rules:

- **Look out for and obey all posted traffic signage** - especially regarding speed limits and chain controls.
- **Slow down!** Speeding is a major cause of winter accidents.
- **Keep your distance from snow removal equipment and do not pass.**
- **Use the free transit services in Town!** If you aren't comfortable driving in wintry conditions, let the professionals do the driving for you.

Mammoth Lakes receives some of the heaviest snowfall in California. The Town's snow removal operators work diligently to ensure safe driving conditions for our residents and visitors. Our snow removal operators work around the clock in twelve-hour shifts that may extend for weeks at a time. Priorities are established to consider which streets need to be cleared first in order to maintain emergency access and safe driving conditions throughout the town.
