

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that the Town of Mammoth Lakes partners with the Inyo National Forest to develop, enhance, and maintain your outdoor recreational experience?

- The Town of Mammoth Lakes maintains approximately 30 miles of National Forest trails within the Town Boundary.
- Three new multi-use, non-motorized trails were recently completed in the Mammoth Lakes Basin with one more planned for completion in Summer 2023.
- In partnership with the Forest Service, the Town grooms over 5 miles of multiuse winter trails which are enjoyed by skiers, snowshoers, fat bikers, and more.
- There are many opportunities for community members and visitors to support sustainable recreation on their public lands including Trail Days, Adopt-a-Trail, Tangle Free Waters, and the Host Program.
- In partnership with the Inyo National Forest and Mammoth Lakes Recreation, through an implementation grant from the Sierra Nevada Conservancy, new infrastructure will be built at the current Sherwins Trailhead. Improvements include ADA accessible vault toilets, paved parking area, interpretive panels, bike rack with tools, waste receptacles, and bear-proof storage containers.
- The much beloved paved multi-use paths (MUPS) throughout town bisect National Forest lands and were a collaborative effort between the Town and the Inyo National Forest.
