→ Did you know that Mammoth Disposal has a new solid waste transfer station?

- Benton Crossing Landfill closed on December 31, 2022 due to lease requirements by Los Angeles Department of Water and Power, who owns the land and leases it to Mono County.
- Mammoth Disposal, as a part of its franchise agreement with the Town to provide solid waste services, built a new transfer station, which is now in operation at 59 Commerce Drive (same as previous location).
- Mammoth Disposal collects all solid waste and recyclables from Town of Mammoth Lakes residents and visitors. Services are also available to County residents who live outside of the Town.
- The new transfer station can also accept household hazardous waste (HHW), bulky items including furniture and appliances, mattresses, paint, green waste such as pine needles and yard debris, construction debris (C&D), ashes, electronics, and metals.
- To replace the former role of Benton Crossing, Pumice Valley Landfill (located approximately 5 miles east of U.S. 395 on Hwy 120 East) can also accept solid waste from residents of Mono County including Mammoth Lakes.
