MAINTAIN AND ENHANCE THE TOWN'S RECREATION INFRASTRUCTURE

Complete Phase II "Interior Improvements" of the Community Recreation Center (CRC)

Community Recreation Center (CRC) – PR 1 & PR 2

(1) LA Kings Ice at Mammoth Lakes

(2) Mammoth RecZone

Lead and/or support efforts to provide multi-purpose, year-round, indoor, and outdoor recreation amenities in Mammoth Lakes.

(1) Mammoth Lakes Community Dog Park - PR 7

- Town Council awarded the bid to DG Construction. Work commenced in late September, with a 6-8 week completion schedule (weather dependent).
- Utilities and storm drains have been installed and rough grading completed.
- Contractors have resumed work, with the installation of fencing, gates, 5,000 sf of dog turf, prefabricated restroom, benches, dog waste leash posts and trash expected to be completed by Labor Day weekend.

(2) Park at the Parcel – PR 12

- Playground equipment and fencing has been installed at the 2-5 childcare site.
- The larger 5-12 year-old playground, surfacing and restroom have been installed.
- Ribbon Cutting and groundbreaking for the Parcel and Park is scheduled on August 7 from 12-2pm).

(3) Mammoth Arts and Cultural Center (MACC) – GF 9

- The Mammoth Lakes Foundation is moving forward with a 2-phased plan to renovate Edison Hall, which will then support an addition of a 250-seat theatre that will be connected to Edison Hall. The Edison Hall renovation is the first phase of the project and will commence this fall using private donor funds raised by the Foundation, followed by the second phase which is the construction of the theatre utilizing public funds (Measure C bond and Measure U funds).
- On February 21, Town Council adopted the Resolution approving the form and authorizing execution of certain lease financing documents in connection with the offering and sale of certificates of participation relating thereto to finance the cost of construction and equipping a new town facility and the cost of acquiring certain land and improvements and authorizing and directing certain actions with respect thereto.

• HMC and Town staff are reviewing the final design and cost estimate for the MACC.

(4) Edison Theatre

• The Edison Hall will be closed for renovations this spring/summer and will reopen in the fall. The existing Edison Theatre will be replaced with a smaller, black box rehearsal/theatre space to create enough room for support facilities for the new, larger theatre.

(5) Bike Park/Pump Track Concept – PR 9

- The bike park concept/pump track is identified in the Town of Mammoth Lakes 2022/23 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).
- Town Council directed staff to construct bike features on the MLF site. Sale is still pending, but staff are scheduling a site visit to assess feasibility.
- Funding is not secured for this project.

(6) Mammoth Lakes Bouldering Park – PR 10

- The Bouldering Park is a complementary amenity at Mammoth Creek Park that incorporates the inclusive National Demonstration Site playground and the CRC realizing the vision of a recreation destination.
- Staff are purchasing a custom pre-fabricated boulder with 1,117 square feet of climbing surface similar to the image below.



(7) Mammoth Creek Park West Play Area.

- Redevelopment of open play area adjacent to the inclusive playground.
- Formal plans will be developed with a cost estimate and timing for implementation.
- Town Council allocated \$500,000 to rehabilitate the play area.
- Grass has been installed and will open to the public in mid-August.

(2) Deferred Maintenance Program

Since 2017, the Town has invested over \$1million in deferred maintenance projects at parks and recreation fields, facilities, trails, and pools.

• Several facilities throughout Town have been re-painted, including the Pickleball Complex, Shady Rest Concession, Whitmore Pool and several restrooms.

(3) Amenities Enhancement Program

Will open inventory at Mammoth Creek Park.

Work with Town Departments and community partners to leverage state and other resources to support regional arts and culture, events, and sports related facilities to leverage regional competitions and athlete training.

DELIVER HIGH-QUALITY, INNOVATIVE, AND AFFORDABLE RECREATION PROGRAMMING

Determine plan to revise, amend or develop new Parks and Recreation Master Plan/Trail System Master Plan that includes updated goals and policies, including an analysis of the supply, demand and needs for park and recreation facilities and services within and surrounding the Town of Mammoth Lakes.

The Town of Mammoth Lakes Parks and Recreation Master Plan was published in 2008 and adopted by Town Council on February 1, 2012. Resolution 12-08 approved a General Plan amendment adopting the Parks and Recreation Master Plan and amending the Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Element. The Plan outlines the vision, goals, and tasks for enhancing parks and recreation for Mammoth Lakes through 2025.

2024/25 Parks and Recreation Department Fee Schedule Amendments

On June 19, 2024, Town Council directed Town staff to introduce Resident/Non-resident fees and amend the 2024/25 PRD Master Fee Schedule prior to winter operations at the Community Recreation Center (CRC), which is scheduled to open on Saturday, October 5, 2024.

Town staff have identified several policy questions related to the introduction of a resident/non-resident fee schedule that staff believe needs to be fully analyzed and presented to Town Council for consideration. On August 6, staff will present a program that the Town Manager has approved as an interim measure for implementation this winter at the CRC. This will allow the Commission time to discuss these policy questions and make recommendations for Town Council consideration as part of the 2025/26 fee schedule amendments in March, 2025.
