FY24/25 BUDGET UPDATE

- Quarterly MLTPA contractor bill (\$25,000) and roughly \$15,151.00 in salaries (Summer Seasonal Trail Crew) accounts for nearly all spending thus far in FY24/25.
- Documents attached show breakdown of all budget categories thus far in FY2024/2025.

MAMMOTH CREEK PARCEL RE-ENGAGEMENT

- Per direction from the last MTC meeting, the OOR desires to poll the community to begin conversations on the Mammoth Creek Pacel.

- Formalize existing trails? Pump Tracks? Quiet Recreation?

MLTS SIGNAGE CHANGES AND APPROVALS CONVERSATION

NORDIC PULSE GROOMER TRACKING

- The OOR has engaged Tamarack XC-Ski Area to gauge their interest in implementing Nordic Pulse.

- TOML had initial conversation with the Inyo, Sierra Forever, Mammoth Lakes Tourism, and Mono County on the forest's needs and how we can assist.
